


What is Set Sail?

- A Strategic Plan which helps focus our Diocese on <u>four</u> <u>important areas</u> in our common life and shared ministry as God's Family.
- These are called the Four Ships:
 - Deepening Relationships
 - Transforming Discipleship
 - Renewing Stewardship
 - Engaging Partnerships



1st Ship - Deepening Relationships



- Everything begins with God
- Looking at our own relationship with God through the Baptismal Covenant on a regular basis
- Invited to personally deepen our Christian Faith
- Looking at our relationship with our Neighbour:
 - Those already part of the church
 - Those searching for connection
 - Those that have been excluded


Deepening Relationships - 1st Goal



Goal 1:

To invite every baptized person to renew their own personal faith through regular examination of the Baptismal Covenant.

Deepening Relationships - 2nd Goal



Goal 2:

To further develop our congregations as inclusive, supportive, and non-judgemental communities of faith as we continue to seek and serve Christ in all persons: those already identifying as part of our faith communities; those looking for connections with our faith communities; those against whom wrongs have been done in the name of our faith communities; and the broader community outside of our faith entirely.




2nd Ship – Transforming Discipleship



- Our Relationship with God and Neighbour is lived out through our Discipleship
- Everyone is called to be a Disciple
 - Seeking
 - Learning
 - Living
- Discipleship Formation
- Discipleship Education
- Discipleship Participation
- Discipleship Invitation

Transforming Discipleship- 3rd Goal



Goal 3:

To enable every baptized person to explore and express their faith by entering and entering again into the fullness of their discipleship of Jesus, and lead others to do the same.




3rd Ship – Renewing Stewardship



- Stewardship of God's Resources
 - "All things come of thee, O Lord, and of thine own have we given thee."
- <u>Time</u> How we spend our days?
- <u>Talent</u> How we share our gifts?
- <u>Treasure</u> How we use our money?
- <u>Tend</u> How we care for Creation?
- Renew our understanding that all things belong to God.

Renewing Stewardship – 4th Goal



Goal 4:

To renew our understanding of the true, holistic nature of our stewardship and responsibility to all of God's creation both individually and together as faith communities.

Renewing Stewardship – 5th Goal



Goal 5:

To examine our current environmental footprint in light of the ongoing climate emergency and take action to tangibly reduce the negative impact we as individuals and faith communities are having on God's creation.



4th Ship – Engaging Partnerships



- The Diocese is a Family
 - Churches are Companions <u>NOT</u> Competitors
 - We need each other for the "building up of God's Kingdom"
- God is at work in the world outside the Church
 - People looking for support/resources
 - Groups needing space
 - Where is God in the neighbourhood?
 - How do we join in with God and with others?

Engaging Partnerships – 6th Goal



Goal 6:

Recognizing God in and through others, to partner together across and outside our faith communities to support and engage in shared work, witness, and ministry, and help bring dignity to every human being.
