**INTERMENT OF CREMATED REMAINS OF FAMILY MEMBERS IN
BABY PLOTS**

The dignity of our Baby Sections that have traditionally been used for the casket burial of infants must be retained.

- A request for interment of up to two cremated remains of parents or grandparents above the casket of their child must be made directly with the Cemetery Supervisor. The request must be on compassionate grounds.
- Grandparents must have the written consent of the parents to use the grave-space.
- The proposed interment in an existing child's plot must be checked in our records for site location, plot size, burial space and depth available, presence of a monument or retaining wall and plot ownership. The size of the plot must be large enough to accommodate a maximum of two cremated remains in urns above a pre-existing baby casket.
- A Baby Plot Conversion Fee will apply. The Conversion Fee compensates for the reduced cost of a Baby Plot in contrast with that of a comparable size Family Cremation Plot. The fee is calculated as follows: Current Family Cremation Plot Fee plus HST minus current Baby Plot Fee plus HST equals Conversion Fee including HST.
- A flat granite or bronze base marker may be placed on the grave site, close to the base of a Child's monument. If there is no pre-existing child's monument, one small upright or slant type monument may be placed at the head of the grave. Flat and upright monument sizes are given in our Cemetery Regulations; note that the monument base must be less than the width of the plot. The name of the child should be prominent at the top of the monument, with the name(s) of the deceased parent(s) below.
- The current opening and closing fee for cremated remains will apply to each inurnment above a pre-existing baby casket.

This Cemetery Regulation has been followed since 2006.
