# Sowing Seeds – Growing Community Planning for the 2025 Season

#### Sowing Seeds – Growing Community is a Diocesan initiative.

In 2024, Sowing Seeds – Growing Community completed its first year with a bountiful harvest, which provided fresh produce to the plates of those who needed it.



#### **Gould's Community Food Bank**

Received 37 bags of potatoes + carrots & turnips – approx. 1,900 lbs. plus peppers, lettuce, tomato, and zucchini were delivered throughout the summer.

#### **Gathering Place**

Received 11 bags of potatoes + carrots & turnips – approx. 550 lbs.

#### **Choices for Youth**

Received 3 bags of potatoes + 1 crate of carrots – approx. 150 lbs.

Community Food Sharing Association Received 15 bags of potatoes + 4 crates of small potatoes + carrots & turnips approx. 800 + lbs.

<u>Total distribution</u>: Approximately 3,400 lbs. of potato, turnip & carrots plus peppers, lettuce, zucchini, tomato and strawberries.

To date, we have partnerships with Goulds Recreation Association, Goulds Lions Club, Kilbride to Ferryland Family Resource Coalition, Goulds Community Food Bank, St. Kevin's Roman Catholic Parish, and the Diocese of Eastern Newfoundland and Labrador under the leadership of St. Paul's Anglican Church. We are incredibly grateful for funding from the Anglican Foundation of Canada and Goulds Lions Club, which made this project possible.

During this first year of growth, we had much to be grateful for and learned many lessons. One lesson we learned was the need for more partnerships and communication. In 2025, we hope to engage other church and community groups to participate and potentially increase the harvest. Your involvement is crucial to our success.

Are you interested? If so, you can take ownership of one or more drills. We have 34 x 90' drills. Each group can plant, maintain, and harvest its own area. In the Fall, it can donate the harvest to a food bank or community kitchen of its choice or combine it with others for

central distribution. Sowing Seeds—Growing Community will provide seeds and other supplies at no cost to interested groups.

### There will be NO COST for any group to participate!



An advantage of smaller groups is that they will be better able to communicate among themselves to schedule times at the garden.

In addition to the main garden, we have twelve raised gardens and two higher planting boxes available to new groups for those with mobility issues. We have funding to double the number of raised gardens and high planter boxes.
